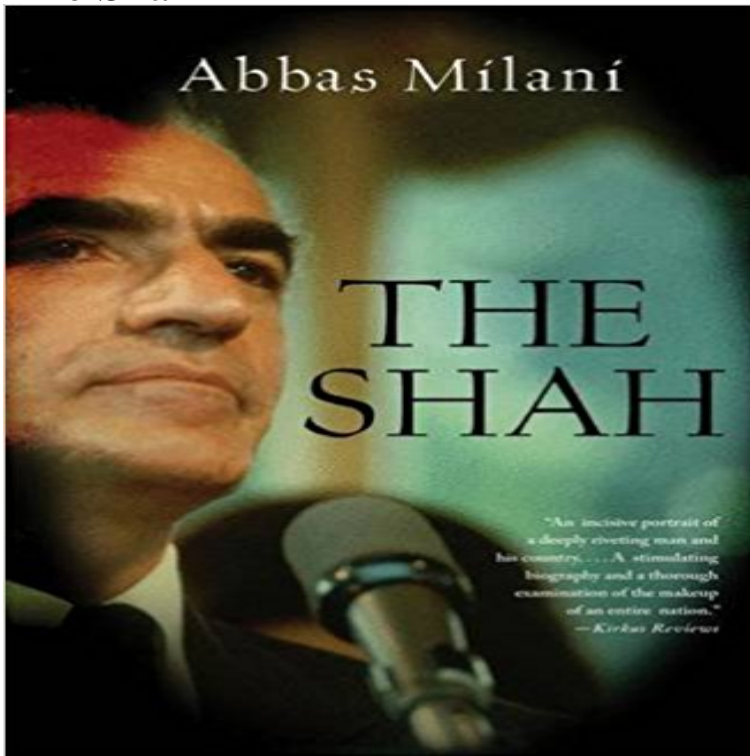


The Shah



Though his monarchy was toppled in 1979 and he died in 1980, Mohammad-Reza Shah Pahlavi, the last Shah of Iran, remains relevant today. He was a social reformer, a romantic egomaniac, and a deeply conflicted man and leader.
