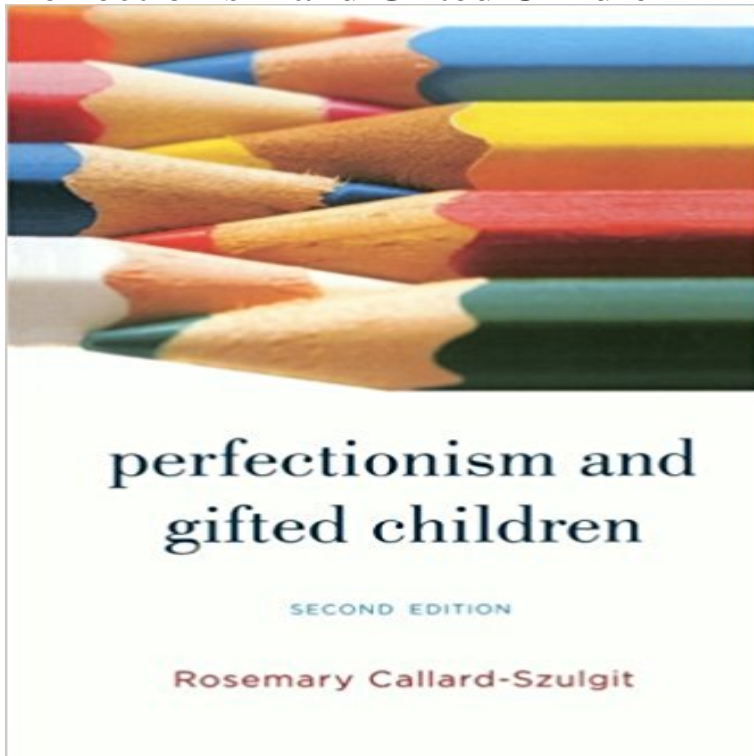


Perfectionism and Gifted Children
