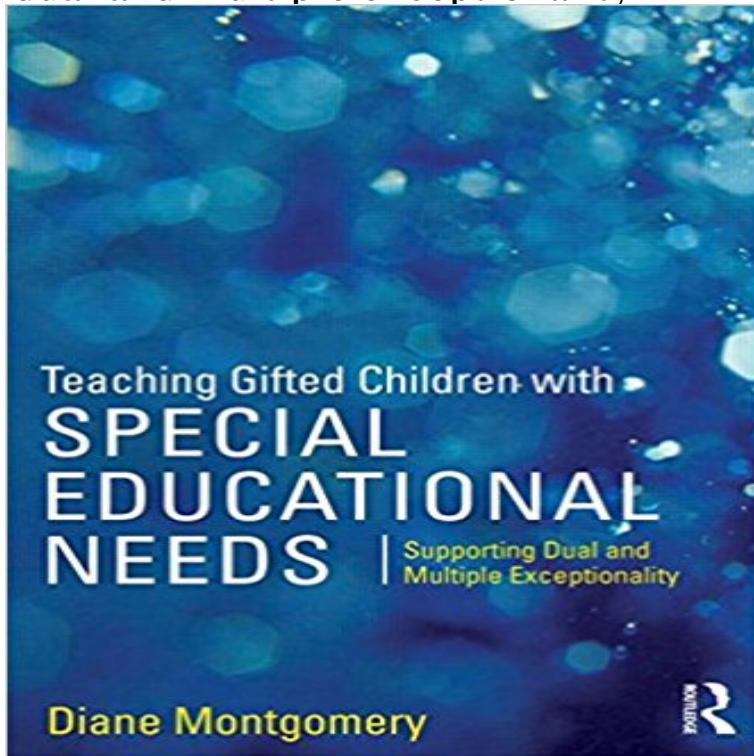


Teaching Gifted Children with Special Educational Needs: Supporting dual and multiple exceptionalities
