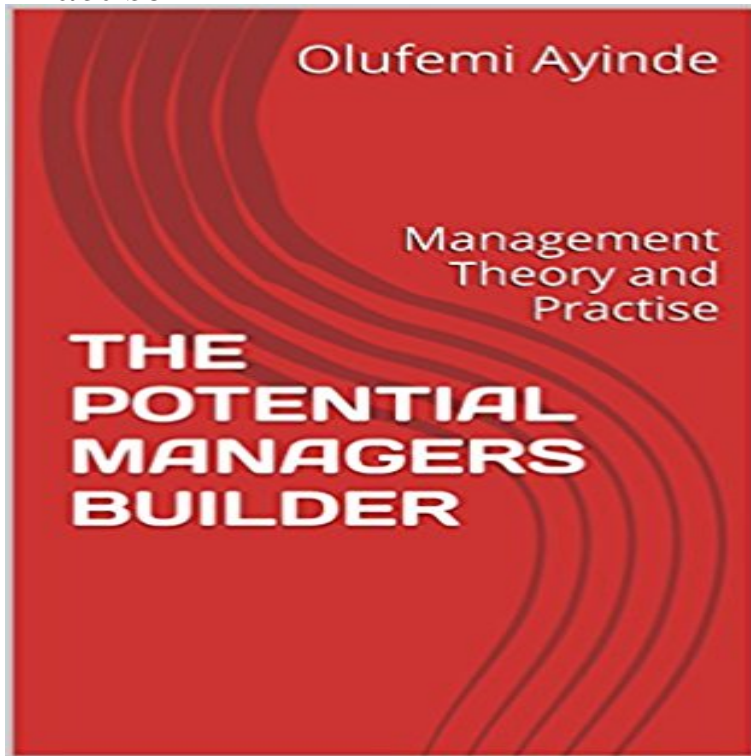


THE POTENTIAL MANAGERS BUILDER: Management Theory and Practise
