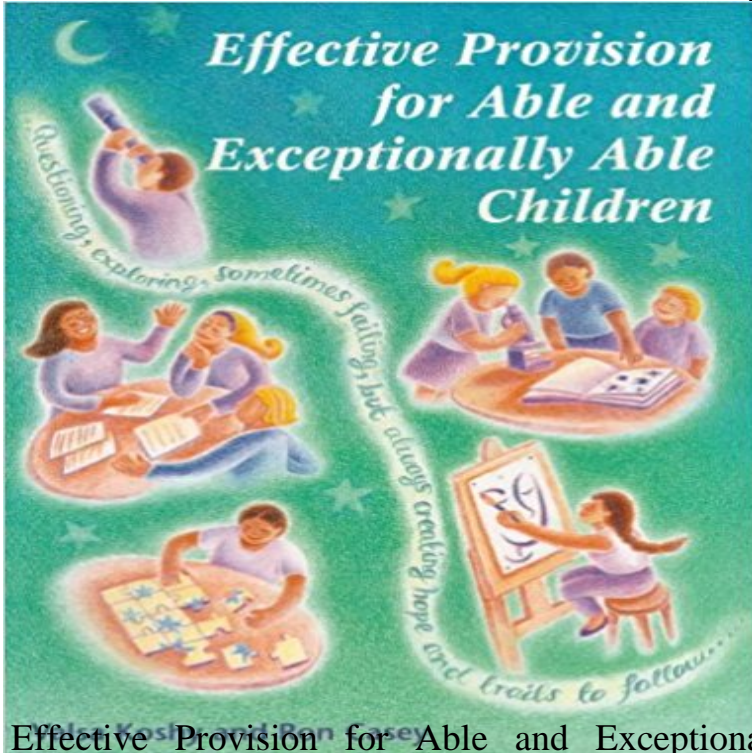


Effective Provision for Able and Exceptionally Able Children
