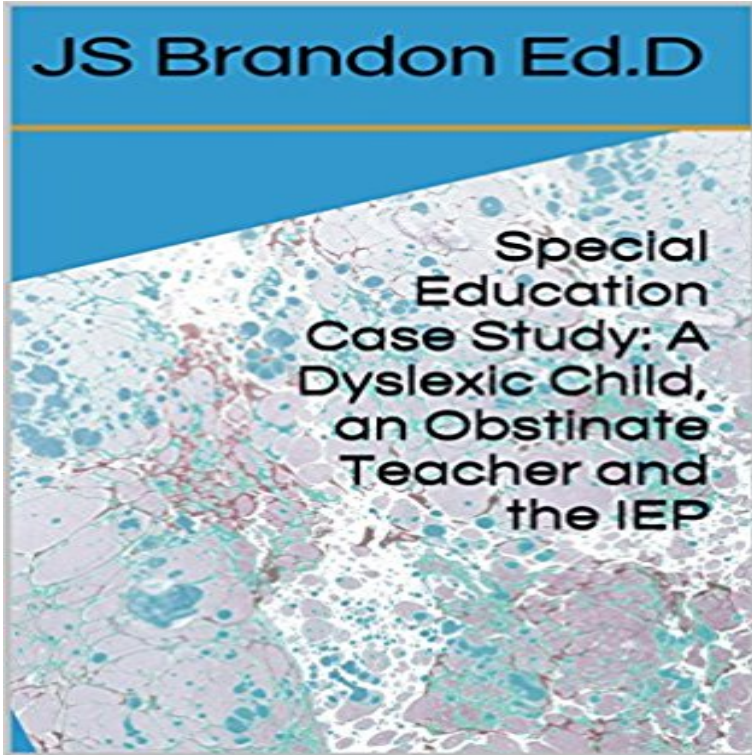


# Special Education Case Study: A Dyslexic Child, an Obstinate Teacher and the IEP



The Individualized Education Plan (IEP) for students with learning disabilities is a well-known document within the education realm in the United States. Years ago, children with difficulties in school were just labeled as children who were “stubborn” or “lazy” or “did not want to learn.” Now we know that some children have learning disabilities in certain areas and the law clearly states that accommodations must be made in the school setting so those children will have an optimal chance at learning. The accommodations are outlined in the child’s IEP. The implementation of the IEP for an identified child is vital and an essential document for the special needs child. This document must be adhered to in every part. Yet, it is not unusual to find educators, although few we hope these days, who still refuse to implement fully or even recognize accommodations that special needs individuals need and deserve. This lack of cooperation on the teacher’s part or sometimes even the principal’s part just frustrates both the child and parents. The child’s learning suffers the most. It is critical that principals and special education directors be vigilant in making sure that all aspects of the IEP’s are being followed and implemented. The following case study deals just with that issue: a stubborn teacher and the consequences of his unwillingness to implement the IEP accommodations for a child in his class. At the end of the case study, there are discussion questions to get the

dialogue going in your class. When I taught special education classes at the university level, I had my students read the case study and then used these questions to challenge my students. I asked them to devise ways to make sure that all school professionals were in accordance with what the law mandates for the special needs children. There are numerous problems on many levels in the following case study. Those soon to be principals or special education directors in your class must realize that it is up to the supervisors to decipher whose actions are detrimental in implementing the child's IEP. All blame should go to the teacher; the special education director and principal have to take ownership in the task of implementing all aspects of the IEP. The discussion questions are geared for thoughtful deliberation among students so they will recognize the problems and devise ways to solve those problems.
