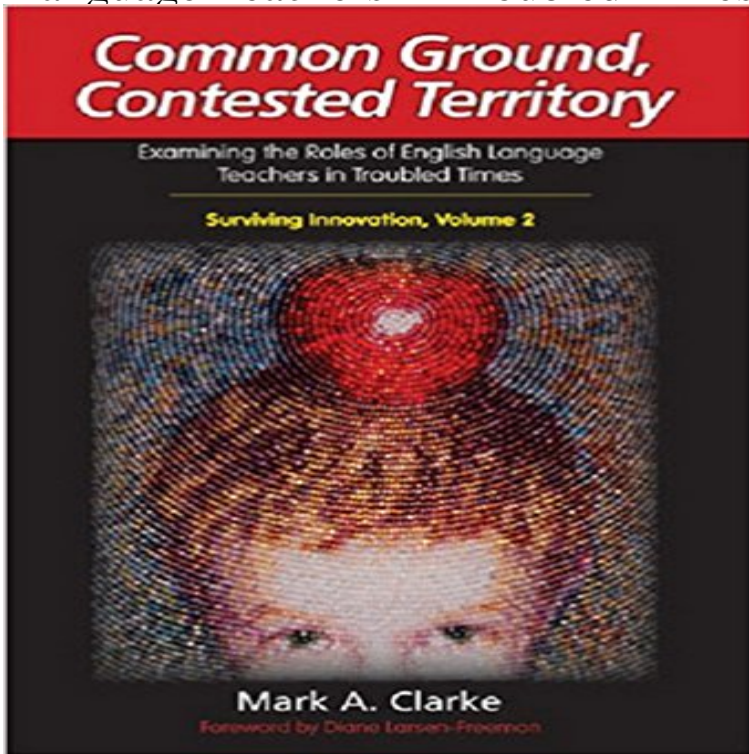


Common Ground, Contested Territory: Examining the Roles of English Language Teachers in Troubled Times (Surviving Innovation)
