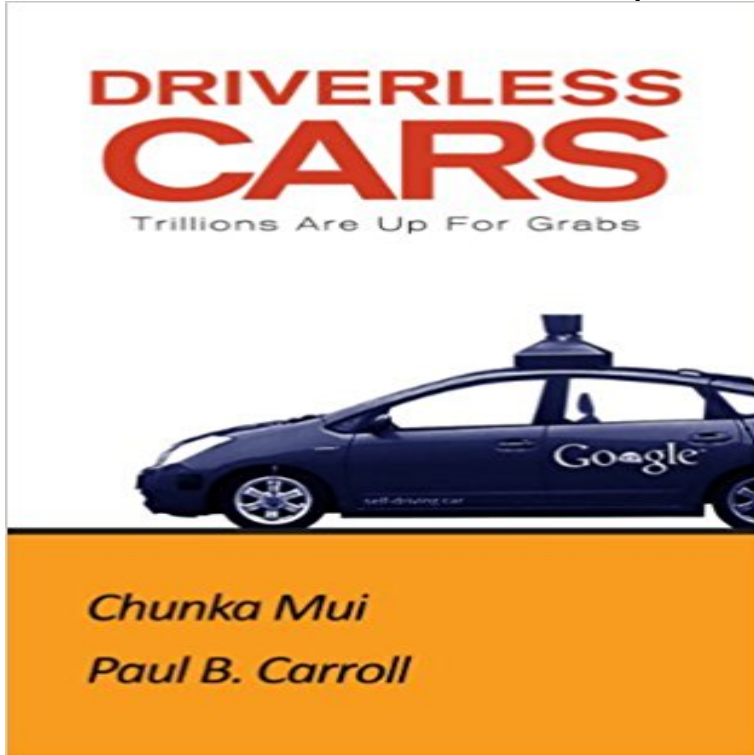


Driverless Cars: Trillions Are Up For Grabs
