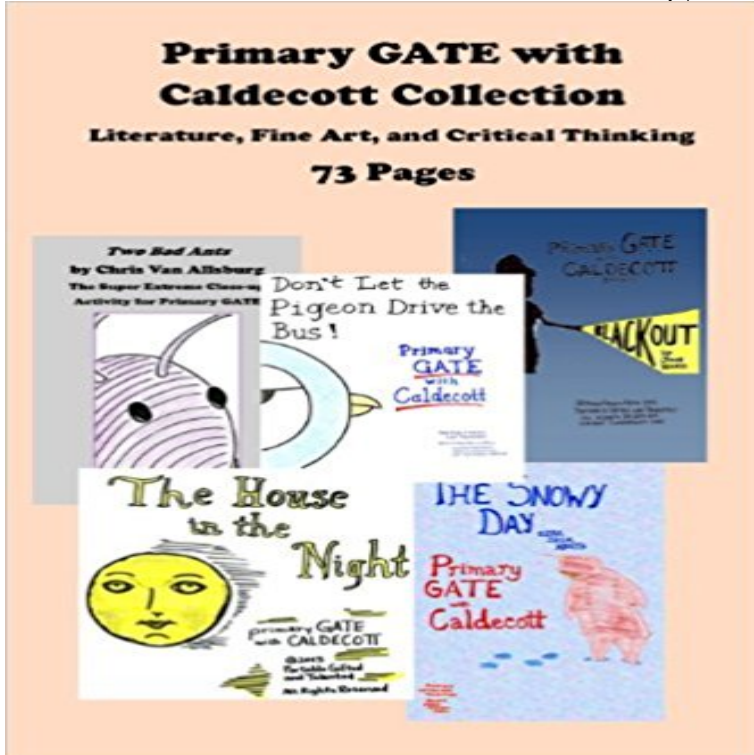


Caldecott Book Lessons for Young Gifted Learners
