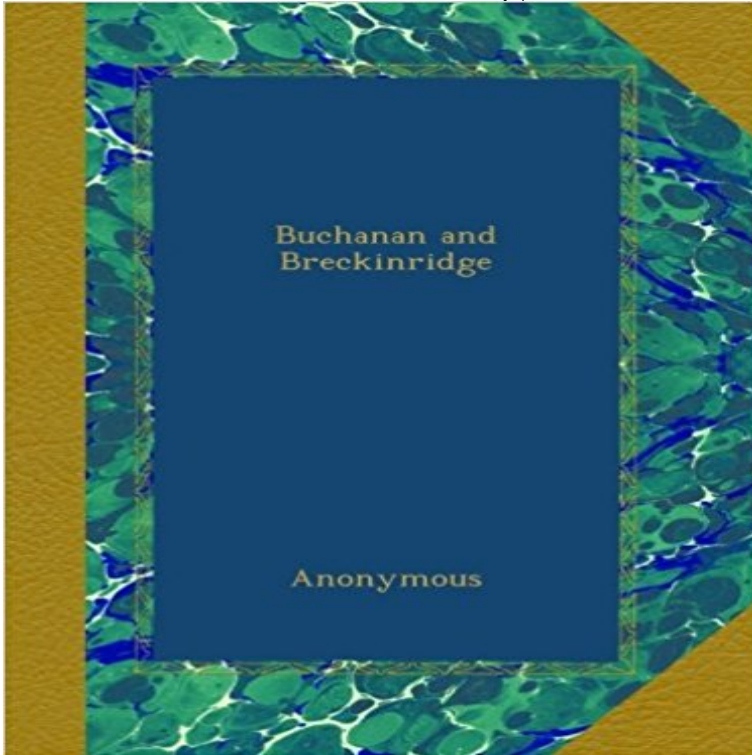


# Buchanan and Breckinridge
