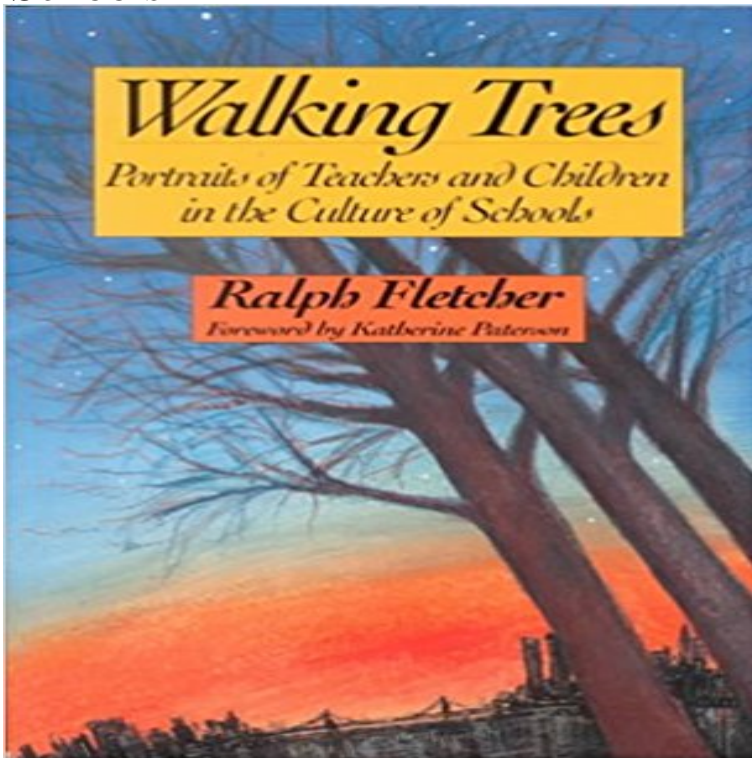


Walking Trees: Portraits of Teachers and Children in the Culture of Schools
